Look around, and you will see evidence of God's living presence in our world.



A box full of pussy willows arrived in my office last week. When Lewis Coffman was a member of the General Council Executive, he brought pussy willows from his garden to the May meeting of the Executive, and now he is continuing that beautiful springtime tradition with the assistance of Canada Post.

The next day, a shrub in our yard that had been nothing but bare sticks all winter was suddenly covered with a profusion of yellow flowers. Next, the hard ground in the park I traverse through on the way to and from work was transformed by velvety green new grass.

These improbable bursts of life after the frozen days of winter were so fitting in the Holy Week time of preparation for death and Resurrection.

Even as we struggle to take in the miracles and mysteries of Easter, we find evidence all around us of God's living presence in our world.
